The University is also proposing to change the name of the program to a <i>Bachelor of Education (Enseignement en français)</i> . The proposed program requires that students complete 20 courses and a 21 week practicum over two years of study. Students have the option of focussing their studies on one of three streams: Early Years, Middle Years and Senior Years. In the Early and Middle Years streams, students will take 80% of their courses in French; whereas, students in the Senior Years stream will take 75% of their courses in French.
